MATHCOUNTS® is a program for 6th – 8th grade students in which math skills are practiced and problems are tackled under the guidance of a coach and instructors. Students are engaged in fun and challenging math work that caters to their level. All are welcome to take part and the top Mathletes® will compete against area schools.

Music & Choir: Besides the traditional music classes, students in 6th – 8th grade have the opportunity to participate in youth music and choir programs. Students in choir perform two concerts a year and have other special opportunities throughout the year.

National Junior Honor Society: The Cathedral of the Risen Christ School is proud to be the only school in Lincoln to sponsor a chapter of National Junior Honor Society (NJHS). Membership in NJHS celebrates the ideals of scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character, and is intended to represent the pinnacle of achievement at Cathedral and in the community. Students with a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher during their Jr. High years (6th– 8th grade) will be invited to apply for NJHS each January.

Page One Reading is a Lincoln Diocesan Catholic Literary Program dedicated to providing students with rich literature, invigorating activities, and an environment that encourages reading for enjoyment. Faith

Liturgy Ministries

Acolytes & Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC): These ministries are a means for men to offer service at Mass both at the altar and in the distribution of Holy Communion; as well as taking Holy Communion to the infirmed or homebound who are unable to attend Sunday Mass. Men are approached and asked by the pastor of the Cathedral to prayerfully consider becoming an acolyte. A series of preparatory classes is then required. Acolytes are installed at a special diocesan Mass celebrated by the bishop in the spring of each year. Every acolyte is strongly encouraged to serve as an EMHC. EMHCs take our Lord in Holy Communion to the infirmed, homebound, and institution-bound parishioners on Sunday mornings. *Contact: Al, 402-423-2627 or AlZach@windstream.net.*

Altar Servers: This ministry offers an opportunity for boys in 5th grade through high school to play an integral role in the celebration of the Mass. General training begins after Confirmation. Music Ministries

One of the Church's greatest treasures is sacred music, from chant to hymns to choral music of both the past and present. - **Cathedral Choir** welcomes ages high school and up. Rehearsals (September through Pentecost) are on Wednesdays, 7:00-8:30pm. The choir sings weekly at the 9:00am Sunday Mass and at Christmas, Holy Week, and at other special occasions, including leading and welcoming singers for Diocesan Choir events.
- **Children's Choir** welcomes all children in the parish from 2nd-8th grade. Rehearsals are weekly (September-April), and singing for Mass is once a month. Children also have the chance to cantor and play instruments for this Mass.
- **Diocesan Choir** welcomes those who would like to participate in Diocesan liturgies such as Chrism Mass and Ordinations. This is an option for those who want to use their musical talents without the extensive commitment for

weekly choir. Invitations are sent out prior to each event for anyone to join as their schedule allows.

- **Cantors & Organists:** In the absence of the choir, trained cantors lead the congregation in common sacred song and responsorial singing. New cantors, high school and older, are welcome. The Cathedral is fortunate to have the Casavant pipe organ—one of the finest organs in Lincoln. Organists accompany the congregational and choral singing, and provide instrumental pieces before and after Sunday Masses. An audition is required for cantors and organists.

Formation

Youth Formation

CCD provides students who attend Kindergarten-8th grade at a non-Catholic school or in a homeschool setting with a formal education in the fundamentals of the Catholic faith. Classes meet on Wednesdays, September-May in the Cathedral School building. CCD teachers are volunteers who see this as an opportunity to be involved in the efforts of the Church to spread the Catholic faith to our youth. Volunteers are always needed. Godteens is a four-year program for students in 9th-12th grade. The primary purpose is to allow high schoolers to deepen, explore, and share their Catholic faith. Weekly meetings are held in the homes of parish families. Topics range from Scripture to morality to everyday issues teens face. Students have an opportunity to discuss these issues and to learn the Catholic Church's teaching in these areas. Students also have the opportunity to go on an annual Godteens retreat in the fall and serve at various service opportunities throughout the year in conjunction with this program.
